As most of you know, I love to read. Well I recently purchased an e-tablet and found several ebooks on Masonic subjects. My favorite so far has been a little book written by Brother Janti Marks entitled Level Steps 100 Daily Meditations for Freemasons. As Brother Marks states in the introduction to his book, he loves the idea "of starting each day with reading a quiet thought" like many small books of philosophy, religion, poetry, and meditation offer. They have inspired him to use this discipline to provide his readers with the philosophy and teachings of Freemasonry. I agree with Brother Marks that there "is an enormous wealth of many Masonic writings" on history or philosophy, however "there is remarkably little to inspire, on a daily basis, the livingout of our tenets in a busy, modern world." Brother Marks makes it clear that his thoughts and comments do not come from any "Masonic authority." They are just his own thoughts in which, in my opinion, he captures the essences of Freemasonry. He hopes that his book will be an inspiration to Masons and a way for others to better understand our order. He begins each of his "100 steps" with a quote of Masonic significance and follows that with his insightful comment on the quote. Here is an example:

"You agree to be a good Man and true, and strictly to obey the moral law." Ancient Charges

Initiation into Freemasonry is an acceptance of a great responsibility. By agreeing to be 'a good Man and true' we enter into an obligation, to ourselves no less then to God, to renounce selfishness and all the little dishonesties that it brings with it. We bind ourselves to act for the general good, making our every contact with others an expression of the truth that we are all one. This is the surest obedience to 'the moral law': to love God and love each other as we love ourselves.
