Masonic Rule of Thumb

Greetings Brethren:

September has had several great masonic fellowship and milestones which included the annual District 2 Picnic, Freedom Lodge hosted an Open House and supported the VA CHIP Event for the Lovettsville Oktoberfest on Saturday 9/24. We have submitted our 2016 Hillman application before the October 1, 2016 deadline. With a few months left in 2016, we have several more masonic events planned which includes November 2016 Grand Annual Communication (11/9-13) and Freedom Lodge Election in December with an open installation (12/2).

This month's highlighted Master Mason has illustrated that Masons are measured by the size of one's heart and not overall height. Born in Bridgeport, Connecticut on January 4th, 1938, Charles Sherwood Stratton was confirmed by doctors that he would never grow anymore, leaving Charles to live his life standing at 3'4". General Tom Thumb became a Freemason on October 3, 1862. Stratton, by now 2 feet 11 inches tall, was sworn in with a man 6 feet 3 inches.



While standing near half the height of the average guy was no problem for Stratton, under the wing of his cousin, businessman and circus legend P.T. Barnum. Barnum taught him the arts of performance, educating him in singing, dancing, comedy, and impersonation. Charles became the world-renowned impressionist for his Napoleon Bonaparte act. Stratton was perhaps most well-known as General Tom Thumb. During his time in Europe, Tom Thumb donated a huge portion of his fortune to a relief fund for victims of the Irish Potato Famine.

The funeral of General Tom Thumb took place on July 19, 1883. Every effort had been made to have it as quiet as possible, and no display was made. His body was enclosed in a walnut casket covered with broadcloth and trimmed with Masonic emblems. The plate bore the simple inscription: "Charles S. Stratton, aged 45 years." The services were conducted by the Rev. Dr. Fairbanks. The Mayflower Lodge of Masons escorted the body to the train which conveyed it to Bridgeport, Connecticut.

Golf Legend, Humanitarian, Freemason

Brother Arnold Palmer has passed to the Celestial Lodge at the age of 87. He was a longtime member of Loyalhanna Lodge No. 275 in his hometown of Latrobe, Pennsylvania, and a 33° Scottish Rite Mason.

Brother Palmer was one of the first true celebrity golfers. He learned to play at the age of 4, and started his professional career in 1954. Throughout his lifetime, he would win 90 championships, and had his own platoon of dedicated fans nicknamed "Arnie's Army," who followed him from one course to the other to watch him play, and made the televised game of golf a popular programming choice in the 1960s. He was the first golfer to earn over \$1 million playing the game and largely responsible for the popularity of golf for the last half century.

Relief is a principle Brother Palmer held dearly as Brotherhood and Truth. He served as Honorary National Chairman of the March of Dimes Birth Defects Foundation for 20 years. In addition, he played a major role in fundraising for the Arnold Palmer Hospital for Children and Women in Orlando, Florida. In his hometown, he is a longtime member of the Board of Directors of the Latrobe Area

Hospital and established a major annual fundraising golf event for that institution in 1992. Brother Arnold Palmer's humanitarian awards included the Order of Eagle Exemplar, U.S. Sports Academy; Arthur J. Rain Award, Catholic Youth Association, Pittsburgh; Lawman Humanitarian Award, Los Angeles; the Theodore Roosevelt Award, National Collegiate Athletic Association: Outstanding American Award, Los Angeles Philanthropic Foundation; Sports Legend Award, Jr. Diabetes Foundation, Pittsburgh; Humanitarian Award, Variety Club International; and my personal favorite, The "Good Guy" Award, American Legion National Commanders.
