The Farmer's Almanac tells us that the March full moon is called the Full Worm Moon and describes it as follows: "As the temperature begins to warm and the ground begins to thaw, earthworm casts appear, heralding the return of the robins. The more northern tribes knew this Moon as the Full Crow Moon, when the cawing of crows signaled the end of winter, or the Full Crust Moon because the snow cover becomes crusted from thawing by day and freezing at night. The Full Sap Moon, marking the time of tapping maple trees, is another variation. To the settlers, it was also known as the Lenten Moon, and was considered to be the last full Moon of winter."

Our inspirational speaker, MW Louis Kerford Campbell (Masonry's Youth – Masonry's Future), a Senior DeMolay, will speak about how his early years in DeMolay inspired him to success as an adult. Freemasonry, In Arithmetic is the fourth liberal Art. Arithmetic is defined as giving value to through numbers things with the use of addition, subtraction, multiplication, and division. We are taught to count, to add, subtract, multiply, and divide values. Later, we use this basic foundation of arithmetic to expand our knowledge of science. Arithmetic offers a structured system which defines basic rule, order, and operates in terms of equations.

The March has several symbols of Arithmetic besides the numbers on a thermometer. March is the third month when Julius Caesar reformed calendar. In the northern hemisphere the vernal equinox occurs in March, when day and night are the same length. This year, contains 3/14/15 March and at 9:26:53 that day will follow the sequence of the mathematical constant Pi  $(\pi)$ , the ratio of a circle's circumference to its diameter, commonly approximated as 3.14159, and is recognized National Pi Day. See if you can think of other March Arithmetic symbols trivia.

Freedom #118 March Masonic Education theme is Jacques DeMolay. March 24, 1919 was the day in history that launched the Order of DeMolay. The Order of DeMolay is based on the integrity of Jacques DeMolay who was burned at the stake on March 18 1314.
