This is March, and this is the beginning of a lot of warm weather, even though we have had a very mild winter thus far. With this said, **LOOK OUT FOR MOTOR CYCLES.** The riders will be out even more now and our Lodge has several Brothers that ride, 2 EA's, Bill MacMaster, Lee McPeake, 5 Masters, Brother Jim Crunk, Tiler Dick Bond, Secretary George Shoemaker, Senior Warden Wes Hirshhorn and myself. Now for the further point of that message. For years, I have wondered about the "Shriners Harley Davidson" and how it came to be. My grandfather was a Mason and in every appendant body and Harley rider. I recall asking how these Shriners bikes came to be. Like my grandfather, there was this mysterious fable of how a Davidson or Harley was a Shriner and that is how and why there will always be "Shriner Bikes". Well now, I know the true story.

As it turns out the in 1958 a Harley dealer order requested that Harley Davidson prepare/build a fleet of motorcycles for a customer, the Local Chapter of the Ancient Order of the Mystic Shrine, now known as the Shriners. The 1958 FL models ordered were different form the normal production bikes in many ways. The most obvious was the paint color. A combination of two tone Hollywood Green and Birch White. For this build there were eleven ordered, and Harley built twelve. Harley delivered the eleven to the dealer and the 12th went to the Harley Davidson museum. This bike remains there and is part of the Harley Davidson Archives Collection. This bike exemplifies the relationship that developed between the Motor Company and the Shriners.

The members with these bikes amused themselves and the communities where they lived with these bikes and their activities. They became famous because of the colors of the bikes, participating in parades, and showing off their many riding skills for the crowds.

The first Shriner Motorcycle unit was established in Kanas City, Missouri in 1948 as a part of the Ararat Temple. That group rode in six parades that year and had multi colored lights on those bikes that were all different Harley Davidson Models.

Since 1966, Harley Davidson Motor Company was clearly deeply committed to this bike building, Harley Davidson made the ordering of these bikes clear. Each bike is to be built per the individuals Shriners specifications and to be ordered only by one on separate order forms. Only the Police bikes can be ordered this way. In both cases, there is a requirement to prove you are a Shriner for the Shriners Bike or Police for the Police bike. Moreover, these bike model numbers will always begin with "FL". So now, you know the story about the Shriner Bike, even if you did not want to know. Fitting for this time of year and a dinner table conversation.
