PINK MOON THIS IS MOON LODGE MONTH **WEAR YOUR BIB OVERALLS OR JEANS**

Your full moon commentary is brought to you this month by FullMoonPhases.com. The pink moon name came from the herb moss pink, or wild ground phlox, which is one of the earliest widespread flowers of the spring. The Pink Moon of April is sometimes referred to by names associated with other signs of full spring. In other cultures, this full moon is sometimes called the Sprouting Grass Moon, the Egg Moon, and among coastal tribes the Fish Moon, because this was the time that the shad swam upstream to spawn.

The month of April witnessed the formation of several United States Grand Lodges; the Grand Lodge of Maryland (April 19, 1787), the Grand Lodge of New Hampshire (April 8, 1790), the Grand Lodge of Illinois (April 28, 1840), the Grand Lodge of California (April 18, 1850), and the Grand Lodge of West Virginia (April 12, 1865). These Grand Lodges have Moon Lodges. In the early days, many Masonic lodges used to organize their meeting nights to coincide with the phase of the full moon. This had a lot to with the fact that transportation was very poor then. Getting from home to lodge was often a problem. Having lodge the same night as a full moon was to help ensure the brothers traveling to and from lodge would have the advantage of the bright moon to aid them in navigating on the rough country roads and footpaths.

Our April Stated is to recognize our Moon Lodge past with the brethren wearing overalls and no ties allowed. We will have a presentation on Moon lodges. I look forward to seeing you at our Stated meeting, degrees, and practices in April – the true Moon Lodge Master Mason month.
