Correct in the West A monthly column by Harris McGarrah, PDDGM, Senior Warden

When Worshipful Tom asked that I write a column for our monthly Trestleboards, I wondered what I might write about. Well I thought I would write on educational Masonic subjects that have been of interest to me or that I was curious about. And while I will be doing that, I would also like to invite you to let me know if you have anything you would like me to research and present in the Trestleboard.

Since this is being written from the West I thought, at least this month, I would discuss something the Senior Warden brings up at the opening and closing of each Master Masons Lodge, the Wages of a Master Mason. Have you every received Master's wages from the Lodge? What are they? The Masonic Services Association of North America's Short Talk Bulletin of February 1933 entitled <u>A MASTER'S WAGES* presents it</u> this way:

"Our Operative brethren received their Master's Wages in coin of the realm. Speculatives content themselves with intangible wages - and occasionally some are hard pressed to explain to the wondering initiate just what, in this practical age, a Master's Wages really are. The wages of a Master may be classified under two heads; first, those inalienable rights which every Freemason enjoys as a result of fees, initiation and the payment of annual dues to his Lodge; second, those more precious privileges which are his if he will but stretch out his hand to take."

The inalienable rights listed in the Short Talk Bulletin include: the right to attend his Lodge, the right of visitation to other Lodges even in strange places, the right to receive relief when needed, and the right to a Masonic funeral. Some of the intangible wages presented are the new acquaintances made, the opportunity to serve both within the Lodge and in the community, and the enjoyment of fellowship just to list a few. Most Worshipful Brother Benjamin Franklin, Grand Master of Pennsylvania in 1760, wrote:

"Masonic labor is purely a labor of love. He who seeks to draw Masonic wages in gold or silver will be disappointed. The wages of a Mason are earned and paid in their dealings with one another. Sympathy begets sympathy, kindness begets kindness, helpfulness begets helpfulness, and these are the wages of a Mason."

Breakfast Menu

Yolk Around the Clock: A bagel, cut in half then toasted on the grill, with 2 sunny side eggs in the bagel hole, topped with bacon & cheddar cheese. Served with breakfast potatoes & a fruit garnish.

Bacon & Cheddar Cheese Omelette: Three egg omelette with a touch of cream & cheddar cheese, wrapped in bacon. Served with breakfast potatoes & a fruit garnish.

California Scramble: Two scrambled eggs mixed with red onions & green peppers on a toasted English muffin topped with tomatoes, goat cheese, & hollandaise sauce.

Florentine Benedict: Two poached eggs served atop spinach and an English muffin with gruyere cheese & hollandasie sauce. Served with breakfast potatoes & a fruit garnish.

Fruit Stack: Three pancakes layered with strawberries, blueberries, & bananas, then topped with English cream & powdered sugar.

Spinach & Swiss Omelette: Three egg omelette with a touch of cream, spinach, & swiss cheese. Served with breakfast potatoes & a fruit garnish.

Lunch Menu

Tropical Chicken Salad: Fresh spinach with mango, papaya, grapefruit, & strawberries topped with honey-mustard grilled chicken & roasted sunflower seeds. Served with balsamic vinaigrette dressing.

Linguini Pomodoro with Chicken: Grilled chicken sliced and tossed with tomato basil sauce & parmesan cheese over linguini noodles.

Chicken, Mushroom, & Spinach Crepe: Two crepes bretonnes stuffed with grilled, sliced chicken, spinach, sautéed mushrooms, & our Three Cheese blend. Served with roasted red pepper sauce.

Bacon & Cheddar Burger: A half pound grilled burger topped with cheddar cheese, bacon, lettuce, red onion, tomato, & a pickle. Served with French fries. Rare, Med Rare, Medium, Med Well, Well
