Greetings Brethren

In a folder on my hard drive named "Masonic History" I have a scanned copy of Samuel Pritchard's "Masonry Dissected" dated 1730. In those days, degrees and lectures were done in a question and answer format similar to our catechism format. It is guite interesting to see the ritual words we use today in that 1730 era book. The EA degree looks very much like our EA catechism. I also have a scanned copy of William Preston's "Illustrations of Masonry" dated 1867. By that era, the ritual was written in the form we now use. Section IV is entitled "Masonry considered under two denominations." This section contains many of the words we use in the Fellow Craft Lecture and the "G" Lecture (Receiving in the East). I mention these two examples to stress to you that we speak truly when talk about our rituals coming from ancient times. Also note that these are written rituals. There are written records of Scottish lodges in the 13th and 14th century, but most people is those times could not read or write. So most of masonry in those times and earlier worked from "mouth to ear" teaching. We still do that in modern Virginia Masonry, and as one who has done both "mouth to ear" and "Masonic Cypher," mouth to ear results in better ritual than Masonic Cypher. So as you move forward in your quest to master our ritual, take pride in the fact that you are continuing to do what those who have gone before you have done and plan to pass it on to those who follow you.

I am on tap to provide my "famous" beef stew for dinner at 7 PM. You won't want to miss it! I'll expect to see you there. Friday, the "oneth" of August.
