Greetings Brethren:

On August 4, 1753 George Washington became a Master Mason. The ceremony was held at the Masonic Lodge No. 4 in Fredericksburg, Virginia.

Washington was 21 years old and a young Virginia planter. Throughout history, his character has been emblematic of his Masonic obligations and he remained "a just and upright Mason" from the day of his raising until his death. Washington was a "living stone" and a cornerstone for our United States heritage.

In 1852, Fredericksburg Lodge No. 4 proposed a Washington Masonic memorial. Later in 1923, after years of planning and Freemason donations, the former Revolutionary War Shooter's Hill in Alexandria, Virginia was purchased to build a monument to honor Brother Washington. The George Washington National Masonic Memorial was dedicated in 1932. Today, the memorial is a Masonic treasure that contains many historic Washington artifacts. Greetings Brethren

Grand Lodge A.F. & A.M. of Virginia. We've seen it a hundred times, the AF&AM – Ancient Free & Accepted Masons. But do you know what it means? Did you know there are other letters, such as F&AM, AFM, and FAAM? You can probably guess that F&AM means Free and Accepted Masons and that AFM means Ancient Free Masons and FAAM is also Free And Accepted Masons; but why?

From 1751 to 1813, there were actually two Grand Lodges in England. The difference in AF and AM vs F and states aoes back to a disagreement between these two Grand Lodges in London at that time. One group was called the "Moderns," but was actually the older of the two English Grand Lodges. The other group was called the "Antients," which became the "Ancients" in AF and AM. Due to this disagreement, the two groups broke into separate Grand Lodges. The disagreement was later healed around 1880, but by that time, there were lodges and Grand Lodges all over the United States that were descended from one group or the other, and so each group kept their corresponding initials with which they were formed, (which is the reason why there are small differences within different states' ritual wording and Grand Lodge By-Laws procedures).

Here is a listing showing which States use which letters:

AF & AM States

AF & AM - Ancient Free and Accepted Masons

These 24 AF & AM states include: CO, CT, DE, ID, IL, IA, KS, ME, MD, MA, MN, MO, MT, NE, NM, NC, ND, OK, OR, SD, TX, VA, WV, WY.

F & A M States:

F & AM - Free and Accepted Masons These 25 F & AM states include: AL, AK, AR, AZ, CA, FL, GA, HI, IN, KY, LA, MI, MS, NH, NJ, NV, NY, OH, PA, RI, TN, UT, VT, WA, WI. All Prince Hall lodges are also F. & A.M.

AFM State:

AFM - Ancient Free Masons There is one AFM state: SC

FAAM District:
