From the East

Salute to a Magical Mason

Greetings Brethren:

In last month's Trestleboard, our Mason of note was Benjamin Franklin, famed diplomat, philosopher, statesman, scientist, and American. This month's exemplary Brother has many things in common with Ben. For example, while both men were great Americans, neither was born in the United States. Erik Weisz, was born in Budapest, Hungary. Both men were great men of science, with Brother Franklin counting among his accomplishments many great discoveries and with Brother Weisz acting as one of the early 20th century's first great men of reason, setting about revealing the tricks and illusions of the snake-oil salesmen and mystics that defrauded the public in his time. Both men were also consummate performers who enraptured the public with their talents, Ben Franklin moving crowds with his literary and oratory skills, and Erik Weisz thrilling them with his physical skill a flair for showmanship.

Erik and his family immigrated to Appleton, Wisconsin, where his father served as the local Rabbi. A few years later, the family relocated to the metropolis of New York City, where a young Erik worked odd jobs, eventually becoming a sensational trapeze artist at the age of nine. At the same time, Erik was gaining notoriety as an accomplished cross country runner. Soon after that, Erik discovered in himself a love for magic, performing tenaciously in America before his hard work and tenacity got him off the ground and capable of financing a European tour, where he performed all over, from Spain, to Russia, to London, eventually amassing a small fortune, enough to purchase himself a large home in Harlem, as well as to purchase a dress made for the Queen of England for his mother. Upon returning to the States, Weisz continued to perfect his craft, taking on more and more incredible illusions and death-defying stunts. Of course, as most great performers, Erik did not operate under his given name, instead choosing a stage name borrowed from great heroes of his, Harry Kellar and Jean Robert-Houdin. Weisz was a Brother at St. Cecile Lodge #568 in New York, as well as serving as founding member and president of the Society of American Magicians in 1902, the oldest fraternal society of magic in the world.

THE INVISIBLE LODGE

The following is excerpt from the short talk bulletin prepared by Worshipful Brother Walter J. Harmon, Past Master of Richmond Lodge No. 10, Richmond, Virginia, a magician for more than 28 years, and an active member of "The Invisible Lodge.


In the strictest sense of the word, Lodge, "the Invisible Lodge" is not a Lodge. It is an international organization of Freemasons who also have as their vocation or avocation - MAGIC.

The Invisible Lodge was formed in 1953 by Sir Felix Korim of England, who served as the organization's first President. Member-ship in The Invisible Lodge has been more than 800 selected Masons throughout the world, including such notable and well-known figures in the world of magic as Harry Houdini, Alexander Hermann, Harry Kellar, Howard Thurston, Dante, Lee Grable, John Calvert, Harry Blackstone Sr., Peter Reveen, Sid Radner, and Professor J.K.

Just as the roots of Freemasonry are entrenched in antiquity, so are those of Magic. The magi were the priests of the ancient Medes and Persians. The ancient Greeks and Hebrews knew them as Astrologers, Interpreters of Dreams, and givers of Omens. It is alleged that these priests (the magi) predicted the birth of the Christ Child and were the ones who brought him the gifts of gold, frankincense and myrrh. As ruling monarchs, the priests were referred to as "Kings of the Orient" and "the wise men."

There are certain similarities between the order of the Magi and Freemasonry which should be noted. The word, "Dao" is Persian in origin. It signifies Light and Wisdom and is the forerunner of the word Deity (Bright One). Fire or light was used in the rituals of the magi to symbolize intelligence, knowledge and wisdom

It is the hypothesis of some historians that the Magi even possessed knowledge that has since been lost to man and that they possessed powers that would seem awesome to us even today.
