On September 18, in 1793, the cornerstone of the United States Capitol building was laid and presided over by George Washington. He was wearing his Masonic regalia in an elaborate and formal Masonic ceremony. This historic event was recorded in the Alexandria Gazette issue on September 25th 1793 and can be viewed at the Library of Congress (http://www.loc.gov). The painting of the event by Clyde De Land is at (http://www.loc.gov/resource/cph.3a 15634/). Today, the U. S. Capitol has 540 rooms, covers about four acres, and has 3 million to 5 million visitors each year. The tools used at the cornerstone ceremony are on display at the George Washington Masonic Memorial in Alexandria, VA.

Coincidentally, our District 2 picnic will be held on Saturday, September 19 at Franklin Park, Purcellville, VA. It is the fellowship cornerstone among the four district 2 lodges; Hamilton Thompson No. 37, Olive Branch No. 114, Freedom Lodge No. 118 and Ashburn Sterling No. 288.
