All Master Masons are welcome to attend the Ritual Schools, and <u>all Line Officers</u> <u>are specifically encouraged to attend as many as they can.</u> As a reminder, Line Officers are expected to be proficient in all three degrees in order to earn your Warden's Certificate which is required in order to assume the office of Worshipful Master.

As a reminder, Freedom Lodge has its own ritual schools on the 3rd Wednesday of each month. We meet at a local dinery for a meal and fellowship, then repair to the lodge for ritual work. I heartily encourage each of you to attend either ours or the District's schools for work. A reminder for the line officers that each of you must be able to open, close and execute the degree ritual for all three degrees in order to obtain your Warden's Certificate which is required in order to assume the Master's station in the East.
