# From the South

Brothers,

As we are still on the front end of our 2026 adventures, I want to emphasize the importance of community building. Masons often wonder why their fund raisers fail, or their events are sparsely attended; it has been this way in every Lodge I have had the privilege of sitting in. There are many reasons for these, but predominantly it is because Lodges have become reclusive introverted organizations. We have to make a concerted effort to become part of Lovettsville once again.

On Monday January 12th I met with Sarah Moseley, the Community Outreach Coordinator for the town of Lovettsville. We discussed the various ways that Freedom 118 can re-introduce itself to the community. I say this because Sarah, who handles community outreach and works heavily with the civic organizations in town, had only recently learned the Lodge's location. Sarah and I reviewed her 2026 calendar of events to help create awareness for the Lodge. Many of these events are free and only require 3-4 Brothers and their families to make an impact. We will discuss these opportunities in Lodge and I will send more information out as we decide where to invest our energy.

The first event that Sarah is promoting will be the **LOVETtsville full of heART** event. This event showcases the local elementary school's art projects in Lovettsville businesses, post office, library, and other places throughout town. We have volunteered our outdoor display case, "Hiram," for this event. In addition to celebrating the little one's art, the civic organizations of Lovettsville are invited to decorate a tree in the Squirkle with hearts. Each tree will have a sign and QR code for the organizations. This event runs from February 2nd to March 2nd. Start thinking of creative heart themed Masonic decorations for the tree, more details to come.

The **Sweetheart's Dinner** has been scheduled and the invitation sent last week. As a reminder: we will be meeting at **Market Table Bistro on February 21st at 12:00PM**. 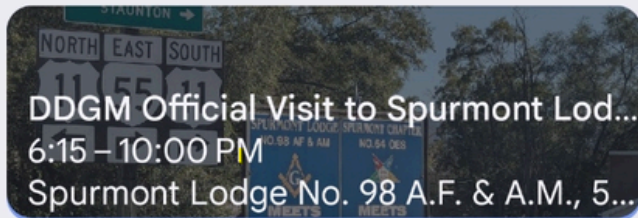

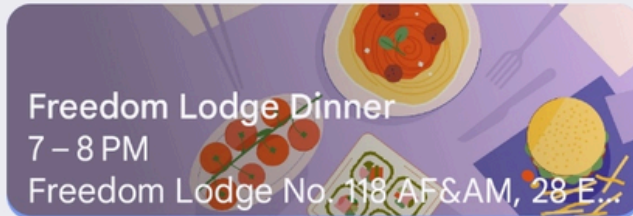

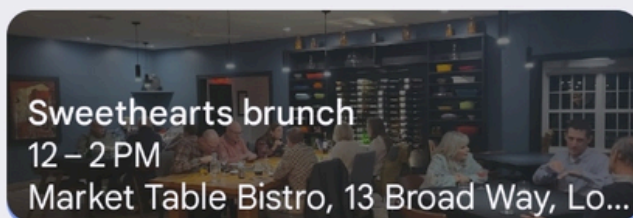

## Drop by Drop Upon the Heart

Brethren,

Nearly twenty-five centuries ago, the ancient Greek tragedian Aeschylus, in his play **Agamemnon**, gave voice to a profound and sobering truth:

*“He who learns must suffer. And even in our sleep, pain which cannot forget falls drop by drop upon the heart, until, in our own despair, against our will, comes wisdom through the awful grace of God.”*

These words are not gentle. They speak of an inexorable law: wisdom is rarely the fruit of ease or mere study. Knowledge may be acquired in the Lodge or the library, but true wisdom—the kind that tempers the soul and fits us for the Greater Light—is frequently hammered out on the anvil of adversity.

As Freemasons, we understand this intimately. Our rituals teach that the rough ashlar does not become a perfect cube by gentle persuasion alone. The common gavel, the chisel, the gauge—each tool is firm, even severe. They strike, they cut, they measure, removing what is superfluous until only that which is square and true remains.

So it is with the trials that Divine Providence permits to visit us: loss, disappointment, failure, the silent grief that no one else sees. These are not punishments, but working tools of a higher order. Pain has a memory; it drips, drop by drop, even into our rest, wearing away pride, softening the heart, and—against our natural resistance—instilling humility, patience, and understanding.

This is the awful grace of which Aeschylus speaks—not grace as soft comfort, but grace as **correction**, as the stern yet loving hand of the Great Architect shaping us for the spiritual temple we are called to build.

Brethren, when the dark hours come—as they will to every man—let us not waste them in complaint or rebellion. Let us meet them with the Masonic virtues: humility to receive the lesson, reflection to discern its meaning, and fortitude to endure until the purpose is revealed.

In this way, what seems affliction becomes instruction; what feels like loss becomes gain. From the crucible of suffering, by the awful grace of God, emerges the wiser, more polished stone—better fitted to take its place in that house not made with hands, eternal in the heavens.

May we so bear ourselves in every trial, learning with submission, growing in wisdom, and ever striving to be more worthy of our sacred calling.
